Program Delivery

Since school and youth group sign-ups opened on October 1, 2025, twelve schools, including three new ones, have registered to bring 934 students with 98 teachers. Fifteen youth groups, seven of which are new, have signed up to bring 359 young people and 65 leaders. A teacher told us, “*We have participated in this program since it originally started. It is exactly what the kids need as they meet and interact with experts to support their learning...I'm looking forward to another year of this fantastic event*”, said an Embers Leader. Quick uptake by teachers and youth group leaders attests to the value of the ESfS program!
